

What Does a Daily Novel Study Look Like?

Definition Simply put, a novel study is a group of comprehension questions, short essay questions and critical thinking questions created by the teacher for students on a specific book.

Daily

- Teacher introduces skill focus; partners up readers; students read chapter; within groups, students complete skill focused graphic organizer/ critical thinking questions; students share answers with class, teacher monitors for correctness
- Teacher creates a time in class when the chapters are read aloud by teacher and/or students, and the questions are answered in a group discussion.
- Teacher reads chapter, calls on students to read various paragraphs, assists students in answering questions
- Teacher reads chapters to students, within groups students complete skill focused graphic organizer/ critical thinking questions; students share answers with class, teacher monitors for correctness
- Teacher reads chapters to students and assists students in answering questions
- Students are paired up to read chapters and answer questions together
- Students are put into cooperative groups to read chapters and answer questions together
- Students read the chapters and answer questions on their own
